## Chapter 10.

Resolve directing the mode of authenticating securities issued by the State.

*Resolved*, That all State securities or certificates of stock, hereafter issued on the faith and credit of the State, shall be signed by the Treasurer, as such, countersigned by the Governor, attested and numbered by the Secretary of State, and a record of the number of every such security or certificate of stock, together with the date and amount thereof, the rate of interest thereon, shall be made and kept by the Secretary of State. *Provided, however*, certificates of interest on any such securities or certificates shall be signed by the Treasurer only.

All State securities to be signed by the Treasurer, countersigned by the Governor, and attested, numbered and recorded by the Sec'y of State.

## Chapter 11.

Resolve in relation to Military Pensions.

*Resolved*, That the Committee on Military Pensions, be and they hereby are instructed to adopt the same rules and regulations, and to require the same evidence, so far as practicable, in all applications for pecuniary relief in consequence of injuries received in the actual service of the State for the protection of the northeastern frontier, as are prescribed by an Act of Congress entitled "an Act to provide for persons who were disabled by known wounds received in the revolutionary war," passed April 10th, 1806.

Evidence for military pensions to be the same as required by Act of Congress.
