Chapter 16.

Resolve in favor of Jacob Fish.

Notes to be given
up, on conditions.

Resolved, That the Land Agent be, and hereby is authorized, to give up to Jacob Fish, four notes of hand given by him to the State dated June 4th, 1835, for eight hundred and fifty eight dollars and seventy-five cents each, payable in one, two, three and four years with interest annually, *Provided* said Jacob Fish shall first reconvey to the State, the following described lots of land situate in township number six in the fifth range, west from the east line of the State, to wit: Nos. 6, 8, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 33, 43, 44, 45, 46, 48, 57, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 76, 77, 78, and 79, and *provided* the Land Agent shall be satisfied that said lots are clear from the claims of any person or persons claiming by, from or under the said Jacob Fish.

Resolve in favor of Deacon Sockbason and Joseph Lolah Solmo.

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to draw his warrant for fifty dollars, to be paid from the Treasury of the State, in equal proportions, to Deacon Sackbason and Joseph Lolah Solmo, agents of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians, for the purpose of defraying their expenses to and from the seat of Government.
