PENSIONS.

Chapter 25.

Resolve in favor of Lewis Bailey of Gardiner.

Lewis Bailey,
pension, \$40.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Lewis Bailey of Gardiner, forty dollars in full, it being on account of loss of time, and expense in consequence of his being taken sick, while in the military service of the State in the Aroostook expedition.

Chapter 26.

Resolve in favor of Jane Fish.

Jane Fish entitled
to the benefits
of a Resolve for
Revolutionary
pensioners.

Resolved, That the benefits of the Resolves approved March 20, 1838, entitled "Resolves in favor of certain commissioned officers and others of the Revolutionary War and the widows of such persons," shall be extended to Jane Fish of Bristol whose late husband died out of this State—*Provided* said person shall otherwise be entitled to the same.

Chapter 27.

Resolve in favor of John G. Chase.

John G. Chase,
for loss of Horse,
\$58 63.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State the sum of fifty-eight dollars and sixty-three cents, to John G. Chase of Monroe being in full for the loss of a Horse in March A. D. 1839, while a vidette stationed on the line between Bangor and Houlton.
