**Chapter 49.**

Resolve in favor Alden W. Norris.

*Resolved*, There be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Alden W. Norris of Livermore three dollars per month for five years, in consideration of an injury received by him while in the service of the State.

**Chapter 50.**

Resolve in favor of Samuel Bassick.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Samuel Bassick of Prospect, the sum of four dollars per month, for one year, on account of an injury sustained by him while doing military duty.

**Chapter 51.**

Resolve in favor of Southwood Sibley and E. B. Sibley.

*Resolved*, That the State Treasurer be and hereby is empowered and directed, to allow and endorse on the notes given by said Southwood Sibley and others, dated November 16, 1836, for the farm conveyed to the State by Benjamin Brown, Esq., the sum of twelve hundred dollars and interest thereon from the date of said notes. *Provided however*, no part of said sum shall be endorsed on such of said notes as are signed by Oliver Prescott as surety; and *provided further* said sum shall not be allowed on said notes, until the said South-

wood Sibley and E. B. Sibley shall furnish good and sufficient securities for all that may be due on said notes over and above two thousand dollars, after allowing said sum of twelve hundred dollars and interest.

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### Chapter 52.

Resolve in favor of Ira Fish.

bounty on wheat,  
\$31 65.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Ira Fish of Lincoln, the sum of thirty-one dollars and sixty-five cents, on account of an error in allowing said Fish's account for bounty on wheat for the year 1837.

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### Roll of Accounts

For the payment to cities and towns for supplies, transportation, camp equipage and camp utensils furnished the Militia called into actual service by the State, for the protection of its Northeastern Frontier, and to officers and other persons for making drafts and other services.

The joint select Committee to which was referred the Accounts for supplies furnished and services rendered, in consequence of the drafts of Militia into actual service the past year, ask leave to present the following REPORT:
