Gun House in Frankfort, \$50.  
Gun House in Anson, \$50.

A. Q. M. Gen. to be accountable for the expenditure.

one hundred and fifty dollars; for the purchase of books of instruction for the use of officers of the militia, two thousand dollars; additional for the erection of the gun house in Frankfort, fifty dollars; for repairing the gun house in Anson, fifty dollars. The several sums aforesaid to be paid whenever, in the opinion of the Governor with the advice of Council, the public service may require it; and for the expenditure thereof, the acting Quartermaster General shall be accountable.

### Chapter 62.

Resolve for the erection of a gun house in Limerick.

Gun House in Limerick, \$300.

*Resolved*, That there be erected under the direction of the Governor and Council a gun house in Limerick, in the County of York. *Provided that*, the expense thereof shall not exceed three hundred dollars, and that a suitable site therefor be conveyed to the State to be held for such term as said site may be occupied for the purpose of a gun house,

### Chapter 63.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Holden.

20 dollars for the use of common schools at Moose River.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Samuel Holden the sum of twenty dollars for the use of common schools at Moose river; and the Governor, with the advice of the Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant for the same.
