## Chapter 71.

Resolve in favor of Barlow Dyer.

Barlow Dyer—  
3 dols. 80 cts. for  
wheat bounty.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Barlow Dyer of New Sharon, three dollars and eighty cents for an error in allowing said Dyer's account for said town, for bounty on wheat, for the year 1837.

## Chapter 72.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Pomroy.

Joseph Pomroy—  
military pension,  
48 dollars.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Joseph Pomroy of Levant, the sum of four dollars per month for one year, it being in consequence of a wound received by him while in the service of the State.

## Chapter 73.

Resolves in relation to the sale and conveyance of the public lands in favor of George W. Buckmore and others.

Land Agent au-  
thorized to dis-  
pose of certain  
lands for settle-  
ment.

*Resolved*, That the Land Agent be hereby authorized to dispose of land surveyed for settlement by order of the Legislature, or of the Board of Internal Improvements, in townships, number twelve, range three, thirteen, range four, eleven, range five, nine, range six, west from the east line of the State—excepting however lots number twenty-two, twenty-three and twenty-four, in the aforesaid township, number thirteen range four,

although the townships in which such lots lie may not be wholly surveyed and lotted, he complying with the requisitions of law in other respects. \*

*Resolved,* That the Land Agent be hereby authorized to convey to George W. Buckmore, Samuel Kimball and John Matthews and their associates in proportion as they are respectively interested lot number fifty-six according to the plan and survey of Noah Barker in township number eleven, range five, west from the east line of the State, on which they have erected a saw and grist mill, and also to convey to them and their associates four lots surveyed for settlement in that township agreeably to the provisions of the second section of the Act, entitled "an Act additional to promote the sale and settlement of the public lands."

Land Agent authorized to convey certain lots to G. W. Buckmore and others.

*Resolved,* That the Land Agent is hereby authorized to convey to Dennis Fairbanks or his assigns lot number three as marked in the survey and plan of Thomas Sawyer, Jr., in township F. range two west of the east line of the State, on which lot he has erected a saw and grist mill—and also to convey to him and his associates lots number four, fifteen and sixteen, in the same township, under the provisions of the said second section of the Act of 1838.

Land Agent authorized to convey to Dennis Fairbanks and others certain lots of land.

#### Chapter 74.

Resolve authorizing an exchange of State securities.

*Resolved,* That the Treasurer of State, be, and he hereby is authorized to issue new certificates of stock reimbursable in five years, or for such further term of time not exceeding twelve years as the Treasurer may deem expedient, from the first day

Treasurer authorized to issue certificates, payable in 5 to 12 yrs. at 6 per cent.
