Chapter 81.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Partridge and Benjamin C. Megquier.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid to Benjamin Partridge and Benjamin C. Megquire, the sum of one dollar for every night they shall have been employed in watching the public buildings; and the Governor, with the advice of Council, is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Beni. Partridge and Benjamin C. Megquier, watchers of public buildings—compensation 1 dollar per night.

Chapter 82.

Resolve providing for the repair of the Baring and Houlton Road.

Resolved, That for the purpose of repairing the Baring and Houlton road through the Indian township in the County of Washington, there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council. And the Governor and Council are hereby authorized to appoint an agent to superintend the repairing said road.

Repair of B. and H. road, 300 dols.

Gov. to appoint an Agent.

Chapter 83.

Resolve authorizing the acting Quartermaster General to audit certain accounts.

Resolved, That the acting Quartermaster General be authorized and directed to audit the accounts of the towns and plantations, for supplies furnished in consequence of drafts of Militia into actual service the past year, which may be presented at his office on or before the twentieth day of March, instant, and which are not included in the report of the joint select Committee to which was referred the accounts of cities, towns, and plantations for

such supplies; and to allow the same upon the principles adopted by said Committee. And that he be directed to pay the several amounts in the same manner in which the accounts allowed by said Committee are ordered to be paid.

Chapter 84.

Resolve in favor of Columbus Dunn.

Treasurer of Am-
ity, 12 dollars for
bounty on ani-
mals.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Columbus Dunn, treasurer of the town of Amity, twelve dollars in full for his account for bounty on animals for 1838.

Chapter 85.

Resolve in favor of Jeremiah Smith.

Jeremiah Smith,
5 dollars.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Jeremiah Smith, the sum of five dollars which sum shall be in full for reentering the remains of the late Charles Waterhouse, former Clerk of the House of Representatives.

Resolve in favor of John Smith.

Treasurer of
Readfield, 73 dol-
lars 50 cents, for
rations and pow-
der.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to John Smith, treasurer of the town of Readfield, the sum of seventy-three dollars and fifty cents in full for his account for rations and powder to soldiers, for the year 1839.
