Resolved, That the amount authorized to be borrowed under the Resolve passed February 29, 1840, be eighty thousand dollars, instead of two hundred thousand dollars, as provided in said Resolve.

Amount of loan

200,000, to 80,000.

Resolved, That the amount authorized to be borrowed under the Resolve, passed March 7, 1840, be four hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars, instead of three hundred and fifty thousand as provided in said Resolve.

Amount of loan
changed of from
350,000, to 475,000.

Chapter 99.

Resolve in favor of the town of Hebron.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to the town of Hebron on the first day of January next the sum of seventy-two dollars and sixty-one cents, as an abatement of State tax assessed on said town for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty.

Chapter 100.

Resolve in favor of the town of Orrington.

Whereas in the apportionment of the sum of three hundred five dollars and sixty-two cents upon the town of Orrington, in the State tax of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty, there is an over-assessment of twenty-two dollars and fifty cents occasioned by an error of ninety polls in the valuation of said town. And whereas, in the apportionment of the County tax of the County of Penobscot upon

said town, for said year, there is a proportionate over-assessment, the amount of which, ought in justice, to be abated; therefore,

Abatement of State Tax, \$22 50.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to the town of Orrington, on the first day of January next, the sum of twenty-two dollars and fifty cents, as an abatement of State tax for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty.

County Commissioners to refund the amount assessed in the Co. Tax.

Resolved, That the County Commissioners of said County of Penobscot are hereby directed, out of the Treasury of said County, on or before the first day of March next, to pay to said town, the amount which is over-assessed as aforesaid upon said town, in the said County tax.

Chapter 101.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Partridge.

Compensation for watching public buildings.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid to Benjamin Partridge, the sum of seventy-five cents, for each and every night he shall have been employed in watching the public buildings since the sixteenth day of September last past, and that the Governor with the advice of the Council be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 102.

Resolve in favor of Jones Dyer.

Treasurer of State authorized to change loan with Jones Dyer.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the State be and hereby is authorized to cancel the stock of this State, or any part thereof, now held by Jones Dyer,
