Repeal of an Act of Feb. 16, 1837. passed February sixteenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, entitled "An Act creating the village of Stillwater a Corporation for certain purposes," and all other Acts relating to said Village Corporation, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Chapter 97.

AN ACT authorizing Putnam Rolf to erect a Dam.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Putnam Rolf of Princeton, in the County of Washington, his heirs and assigns, be and hereby are permitted to erect, and maintain a dam across the St. Croix river in said County, at or near the foot of Lewis' Island, and land said dam on the bank of said river, upon the Indian township, so called.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said Rolf, his heirs and assigns, shall observe and be subject to all the laws of this State, regulating the right of passage, for all and every purpose upon streams or rivers in said State.

Chapter 98.

AN ACT to change the name of the town of Milton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passing of this Act, the town of Milton, in the County of Piscataquis, shall be known and called by the name of Almond.
