Proviso.

Chapter 101.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of Government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That in order to provide for the operation of certain Acts and Resolves of the Legislature, requiring the payment of money from the Treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the Government, for the current year, the following sums be, and the same are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury; the same to be in lieu of all other existing appropriations whatever. And the Governor, with advice of the Council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrants upon the Treasury for the same.
