After certificate filed in Secretary's office, tax only on remaining capital stock

after the certificate filed in the Secretary's office, required by the first section of this Act, of such reduction, said corporation shall be held to pay the tax only on the remaining capital stock of said bank.

### Chapter 125.

AN ACT for the relief of John McFarland, Jr.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the County Commissioners of Waldo be, and they hereby are authorized to pay John McFarland, Jr. of Thorn-dike, in said County, such sum of money, as they may think just and equitable, to compensate him for damage done him by the location of a County road across his land.

### Chapter 126.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Casco.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That so much of the town of Raymond, in the County of Cumberland, as lies north-west of the following line, commencing at a point in the south-westerly line of Raymond, as far north-west from the westerly corner of lot number seven, in the first range of lots in Raymond, as Dingley's mill stream, where it enters Sebago pond, is north-west of the north-west line of said lot number seven, thence running north-east-erly, parallel to the said north-west line of said lot number seven, to the centre of the outlet of Thomas' pond, or Dingley's mill stream, thence by the centre of said stream to Thomas' pond, thence in a straight line to the northerly corner of lot number nine, in the

fourth range in said Raymond, thence north-westerly to the corner of lot number eight in the fifth range, thence by the north-westerly side line of lot number eight in the fifth range, to number seven in the sixth range, thence north-westerly to the corner of number seven in the sixth range, thence north-easterly by the lines of number seven in the sixth range, and number twelve in the seventh range, to the range line between the seventh and eighth ranges, thence northerly to the point where the range line between the eighth and ninth ranges is intersected by the check line, between numbers twelve and thirteen in the ninth range, thence by said check line to the range line between the ninth and tenth ranges, thence south-easterly to the westerly corner of number eleven in the tenth range, thence north-easterly, by said lot number eleven, to the line between ranges ten and eleven, thence north-westerly to the westerly corner of number eleven in the eleventh range, thence north-easterly by the line of lot number eleven, aforesaid, to Rattlesnake pond, thence north-easterly to the point where the north-westerly line of lot number twelve in the twelfth range, cuts said Rattlesnake pond, thence by the north-westerly line of said lot number twelve to the line between ranges twelve and thirteen, thence north-westerly to the corner of lot number fifteen in the thirteenth range, thence north-easterly in the direction of the line of lot number fifteen to Poland line, be, and hereby is incorporated into a town, by the name of Casco; and the inhabitants thereof are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, which the inhabitants of other towns within this State enjoy.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the inhabitants of said town of Casco shall be holden to pay the arrears of all taxes, which have been legally assessed on them, and of assessments, which may have been voted by said town of Raymond, together with their proportion of all the debts due from said town of Raymond, at the time this Act shall take effect, and

the town of Casco shall be entitled to receive and hold their proportion of the debts and taxes due to said town of Raymond; said proportion to be ascertained by the last valuation of their respective towns.

Pauper charges, proportion of to pay—

Future paupers, where to be supported.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the inhabitants of the said town of Casco shall be holden to pay their proportion towards the support of all paupers, actually chargeable upon the town of Raymond, when this Act shall take effect; said proportion to be ascertained by the valuation aforesaid. And all persons, who may, or hereafter shall become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as belonging to that town, on whose territory they may have gained a legal settlement, and shall be supported by the same.

Collectors of taxes of Raymond, powers of.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That the several collectors of taxes for the town of Raymond are hereby authorized and empowered to collect and pay all taxes to them already committed, agreeably to their several warrants, or that may be assessed, in pursuance of the provisions of this Act.

School fund, how divided.

SECT. 5. *Be it further enacted,* That the school fund, belonging to the town of Raymond, shall be divided between the two towns, in proportion to the number of inhabitants, according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and forty.

Trustees of sch'l fund.

SECT. 6. *Be it further enacted,* That the selectmen, town clerk and town treasurer, of the town of Casco, with their successors in said office, shall be and forever are hereby constituted a body politic and board of trustees, to manage said school fund for the benefit of said town of Casco, subject to the general law of the State.

Interest in public buildings of Raymond, released.

SECT. 7. *Be it further enacted,* That the said town of Casco hereby releases to the said town of Raymond all their right and interest, which they have in the public buildings of said town.

When to take effect.

SECT. 8. *Be it further enacted,* That this Act shall be in force and of binding effect, as soon as the same shall have been approved by the Governor.
