and Maine rail-road, in New Hampshire: thence extending through the towns of Berwick and South Berwick, and thence northeasterly on the most convenient ground, till it intersects the line described in the Act to which this is in addition.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That for the proper construction of said road, this corporation shall have all the rights, powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, and the State shall have all the rights, in respect to the road hereby authorized to be made, which exist in the Act to which this is in addition. Powers, &c.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the said corporation are hereby authorized to connect their said rail-road with any other rail-road or rail-roads, at any point or points of intersection, on the route of their said rail-road, as provided in the charters of the said rail-roads respectively; and shall be entitled to all the privileges, in the transportation of persons, goods and property of all descriptions, which are provided in such cases, in their respective charters, but not intending to give to either corporation the right of running their locomotive on the track of the other. May connect with other rail-roads. Restriction.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That the said corporation shall be allowed three years, from the time of the passage of this Act, for the actual survey and location of the route of said road, and the filing of the same with the county commissioners, in the Counties through which the same shall pass; and six years for the completion of the same. Time extended three years for location. —and six years for completion of rail-road.

Chapter 146.

AN ACT for the relief of the town of Orono.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the town of Orono be exempted from the payment of five hundred ninety-three dollars and twenty-nine cents, of \$593 29, of Co. tax for 1840, abated.

the tax assessed on that town, by the county commissioners of the County of Penobscot; also two hundred four dollars and thirty cents, of the State tax assessed on the same town, for the year eighteen hundred and forty; those sums, being so much above that town's proportion of said taxes, and which should have been assessed upon the town of Oldtown.

Chapter 147.

AN ACT entitled an Act authorizing the assessment of certain taxes upon the town of Oldtown.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the Treasurer of State shall, forthwith, send his warrant, directed to the assessors of the town of Oldtown, requiring them to assess the sum of two hundred four dollars and thirty cents, upon the polls and estate of the inhabitants of that town, and upon the owners of real estate therein, according to the principles of the tax Act, approved March eighteenth in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty, and requiring the money to be collected and paid into the treasury of the State, on or before the first day of January next.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the county commissioners, for the County of Penobscot be, and they hereby are authorized to issue their warrant to the assessors of the said town of Oldtown, requiring them, in the same manner, to assess the sum of five hundred ninety-three dollars and twenty-nine cents, upon the same inhabitants and owners of real estate, in said town, and require the collection and payment of that sum into the treasury of said County, on or before the same day of January. The said sums being the proportion which said town ought to have been assessed, in and by virtue of said tax Act.
