Chapter 168.

AN ACT in addition to an Act to regulate the survey of lumber in the County of Penobscot.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That whenever the survey or survey and marking, shall be pay Surveyor done by a deputy of the surveyor general, he shall teenth part of pay to said surveyor general for his perquisite, one sixteenth part of the fees therefor.

#### Chapter 170.

AN ACT to incorporate the Ossipee Agricultural Association, in the County of York.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Rufus McIntire, Isaac Dearing, Abner Burbank, John P. Bennett, Arthur McArthur, Gilman L. Bennett, Jonathan Tuck, John Burnham, Levi J. Ham, John A. Morrill and John Jameson, together with their associates and successors, be and hereby are constituted a body corporate and politic, by the name of the Corporate name Ossipee Agricultural Association, with power to prosecute and defend suits at law, to have and use a common seal; to make and enforce any by-laws and regulations, for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to take, hold and Income of cap-ital stock, not to use, any estate, real or personal, the yearly income of exceed \$3,000 which shall not exceed three thousand dollars, to be which shall not exceed three thousand dollars, to be used and employed exclusively, for the promotion of agriculture, horticulture, mechanic arts and manufactures connected therewith; and said corporation shall have power to lease, sell or convey, or otherwise dispose of their funds, as may best promote the objects of their association: Provided, nevertheless, that the powers herein granted may be enlarged, restricted or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

> SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said association may be called, at such time and place, as may be deemed best by any three of the members herein named, and on such notice as they may deem reasonable.
