Chapter 177.

AN ACT to annex part of the town of Fairfield to the town of Norridgewock.

Description.

—from Fairfield
—to Norridgewock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passing of this Act, so much of the town of Fairfield, as is contained in lot numbered nine, on the great lot E two, with the inhabitants thereon, be and the same hereby is set off from the town of Fairfield, and annexed to the town of Norridgewock, in the County of Somerset.

Chapter 178.

AN ACT to repeal an Act entitled an act for the relief of School Districts in Norridgewock and Mercer.

Act of Feb. 7,
1826, repealed.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That “an Act entitled an Act for the relief of school districts in Norridgewock and Mercer,” approved February seventh, eighteen hundred and twenty-six, be and the same hereby is repealed.

AN ACT to incorporate the Augusta Free Ferry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Loring Cushing, Joseph W. Patterson, John A. Pettingill, Benjamin Pettingill, Elijah Ingraham, Elijah McFarland, Elisha Barrows, Junior, Lebbeus Hayward and John K. Killsa, their associates and successors, be, and hereby are incorporated a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Augusta Free Ferry, for the purpose of establishing and running a free ferry across the Kennebec river, in Augusta, and in the same place
