that the debts of the corporation shall not, at any time, exceed fifty per cent. of the capital stock of the corporation actually paid in.

First meeting,
how called.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That Luther Chaney may call the first meeting of the corporation, at such time and place, and in such manner, as he may think proper.

Chapter 181.

AN ACT in addition to an Act for regulating marriage, and for the orderly solemnization thereof.

Clerks of plantations, organized for any purpose may publish intentions of marriage.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the clerk of any plantation, organized for any purpose, is hereby authorized to publish the intentions of marriage between any persons, either of whom resides within the limits of such plantation, and to grant certificates thereof, in the same manner, and under the same restrictions, and with the like effect, as if such publication and certificate were by the clerk of any city or town within this State.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That this act shall be in force from the time of its signature by the Governor.

Chapter 182.

AN ACT to incorporate the Eden Cotton and Woolen Manufactory.

Corporators.

Corporate name
Purpose.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That William Thompson, Richard Higgins and Edward Brewer, their associates, successors and assigns be, and they are hereby incorporated, by the name of the Eden Cotton and Woolen Manufactory, for the purpose of manufacturing cotton and wool, and for the

purpose of transacting such other business in connection therewith, as shall best promote their interest, with power to hold and manage real and personal estate, at any time, not exceeding forty thousand dollars, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all duties and liabilities, mentioned in the several Acts defining the powers and duties of similar corporations.

Capital stock
\$40,000.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the manufacturing operations of said corporation shall be limited to the town of Eden, in the County of Hancock, and State of Maine, and that the three persons, named in this Act, shall have power to call the first meeting of the corporation, in any place within the State, and in any manner they may deem proper.

Chapter 183.

AN ACT to authorize William Nash of Addison, and others, to build a bridge across Pleasant River in the town of Addison.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That William Nash, Jeremiah Plummer, and their associates, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to build and maintain a bridge across Pleasant River, in said town of Addison, at or within one hundred and fifty rods of Addison Point, (so called). *Provided,* said bridge be open at all times, for the accommodation of travelers, free of toll, and shall be built with a convenient draw or passage way at least thirty feet wide, over the channel of said river, for the passing and repassing of vessels through said bridge; and said bridge shall be made of sufficient height for boats, rafts and gondolas, to pass under the same; and said draw shall be lifted, at all times, for vessels to pass and repass, without pay or toll.
