SECT. 7. *Be it further enacted,* That the county commissioners, in their respective counties, when duly authorized to assess a county tax, shall apportion the same on the several cities, towns, plantations, and other places therein, according to the proportion at which they are rated in this Act. And in the assessment of all county, city, town, plantation, parish or society taxes, the assessors of each city, town, plantation, parish, society or other place, within this State, shall govern themselves by the same rules, and assess the polls therein, in the proportion as they may be assessed to pay a State tax by virtue of this Act, having regard to all such alterations of polls and property as may happen within the same subsequent to the assessment of the tax made by this Act, excepting such parishes and societies, for which a different provision for assessing their taxes is made by law: *Provided always,* That it shall be lawful for any city, town, plantation, parish or society, to make, levy and collect any county, city, town, plantation, parish or society tax according to a new valuation, and for that purpose to cause a new valuation to be taken therein, at any time of the year which may be determined upon, at a legal meeting to be warned for that purpose.

SECT. 8. *Be it further enacted,* That the assessors shall make their several rate lists, to be committed to the collectors or constables, in such form, in substance, as shall be prescribed by the Treasurer of the State, when he transmits his warrants to the several cities, towns and plantations as herein directed.

County Commissioners to assess County tax on towns, &c. according to proportion rated in this Act.

Assessors of towns, &c. to be governed by rules of this Act.

Proviso.

Rate lists of assessors to follow form prescribed by Treasurer of State.

Chapter 199.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of Government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That in order to provide for the operation of certain Acts and Resolves of the Legislature, requiring the payment of money

from the treasury ; and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the Government for the current year, the following sums be, and the same are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury. And the Governor, with the advice of Council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrants on the Treasurer of the State for the same.

Chapter 200.

AN ACT dissolving the incorporation of the town of Dearborn.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the Act incorporating the town of Dearborn, in the County of Kennebec, be and the same hereby is repealed, and that said incorporation is dissolved.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the territory and inhabitants, comprising the present town of Dearborn, be and the same hereby are created a plantation, by the name of the Dearborn plantation, with all the privileges, immunities and liabilities, to plantations corporate incident.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That said plantation and inhabitants, shall be, and are liable for all debts now due or owing from said town in its corporate capacity. This Act shall take effect from and after its approval by the Governor.
