Chapter 112.

RESOLVE providing for the promulgation of the Laws of the State.

Portland Advertiser—

—State paper.

Resolved, That the Portland Advertiser, a newspaper printed in Portland, be and the same hereby is declared to be the public newspaper in this State; in which shall be published the Laws and Resolves of a public nature; and also all advertisements, notices and orders, required by law to be published in the public newspaper of the printer to the State.

Resolves inconsistent, repealed.

Proviso.

Resolved, That all Resolves or parts of Resolves, inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed; *Provided*, that the Eastern Argus shall be continued a public newspaper so long as may be necessary to complete the publication of any notice or order already published in said paper, and for no other purpose.

When to take effect.

Resolved, That these Resolves shall take effect from and after their approval.

Chapter 113.

RESOLVE in favor of Daniel Brown.

Daniel Brown,

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this State, to Daniel Brown of New Sharon, three dollars per month for one year, in consequence of a wound received by him while doing military duty.

Chapter 114.

RESOLVE in favor of Cyrus Clark.

Cyrus Clark,
\$36.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State, to Cyrus Clark of Frankfort, the sum of thirty-six dollars, in full, on account of an injury sustained by him while doing military duty.
