#### Chapter 121.

RESOLVE in favor of Moses R. Ludwig.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of State be directed to discharge Moses R. Ludwig from any liability on a bond. Certain bond given the sixteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, to the Warden of the State Prison, by Joseph Fowler as principal and said Moses R. Ludwig as surety; on condition, that the petitioner pay condition any costs and expenses, that have accrued thereon against the State.

#### Chapter 122.

RESOLVE in favor of Benjamin F. Edmonds.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury, to Benjamin F. Edmonds of Mexico, the sum of ten side. Edmonds, dollars, in full for money advanced by him, for the expense of the sickness of his son in the Aroostook expedition.

### Chapter 123.

RESOLVE in favor of James P. Philbrook.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of J. P. Philbrook, the State, to James P. Philbrook of Augusta, the sum \$10. of ten dollars, in full for his services for storing certain pieces of cannon, belonging to the Oxford division of the Maine militia, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.
