as though he had taken the oath of office as required by the Constitution and laws; and the doings and acts of any and of all the officers of said town of Hampden, are not, and shall in no wise be invalidated or rendered illegal, by the failure of the said John Nourse to take the oath of office as aforesaid, but they are and shall be, of the same force and effect, as though the said John Nourse had complied with the requirements of the Constitution and laws.

#### Chapter 129.

### **RESOLVE** in favor of the town of Brooks.

**Resolved**, That there be paid out of the treasury of Brooks, \$104 90, the State, to the town of Brooks, the sum of one hunfor six tents, for dred and four dollars and ninety cents, for six tents procured by said town for the use of soldiers drafted into the service of the State, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. Provided, that the tents aforesaid, shall first be delivered to the keeper of the State's arsenal at Bangor, and producing his receipt for the same.

### Chapter 130.

**RESOLVE** in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

*Resolved*, That there be expended from the fund which has or may arise from the sale of timber of the \$150 for repair Indian township, a sum not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars, for the repair of the church at Pleasant point, to be laid out by the agent for said Indians, under the direction of the Governor and Council.
