#### Chapter 148.

RESOLVE in favor of Loren Robinson.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of Robinson, this State, to Loren Robinson of Brownfield, the sum of forty dollars, in consideration of a wound received by him while doing military duty.

### Chapter 149.

RESOLVE in favor of Freeman Nickerson.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of Freeman Nick-the State, the sum of fifty-five dollars, to Freeman horse lost in Nickerson of Swanville, being in full for the loss of a Arostook expension of Swanville, and the Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, while a vidette stationed on the line between Bangor and Houlton.

### Chapter 150.

RESOLVE in favor of Benjamin Johnson and others.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this State, from any moneys not otherwise appropriately. B. Johnson, E. ated, to each of the following persons, to wit: Ben-ley, T. Sanborn, jamin Johnson, Elisha Chick Jr., Adino P. Atwood, A. F. Blaisdell, J. James Haley, True Sanborn, Ebenezer Blaisdell, Scampbell, R. K. James Arey Jr. and Daniel Campbell, all of Frank-Andrews and O. Farker, Slo fort, in the County of Waldo; Reuben K. Stetson each. and John L. Andrews of Hampden, and Oliver Parker of Bangor, in the County of Penobscot, the sum of ten dollars, in full for travel and attendance as witnesses before the committee on banks and banking, on the subject of the Frankfort Bank.

That there also be paid to J. Wingate Carr of Ban-J. W. Carr, gor, four dollars and twenty cents, to Isaac Twombly in Twombly, of said Frankfort, three dollars and fifty cents, and to

### Chapter 151.

RESOLVE in favor of Samuel C. Stevens.
