Chapter 152.

RESOLVE for the payment of accounts against the State.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid, from the treasury of the State, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several cities, towns, plantations

and persons mentioned in Roll number twenty-two, the sum set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of twenty-two thousand, nine hundred eight dollars and forty-eight cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.

[Approved April 10, 1841.]

Chapter 153.

RESOLVE laying a tax on the several Counties in the State.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the several Counties contained in the following schedule be, and the same are hereby granted as a tax for each County respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debt and necessary expenses of the same and other purposes ordered by law.

- York, Five thousand five hundred dollars,
- Cumberland, Seventeen thousand dollars,
- Lincoln, Eight thousand dollars,
- Hancock, Five thousand five hundred dollars,
- Washington, Five thousand dollars,
- Kennebec, Twelve thousand six hundred and forty-two dollars,
- Oxford, Five thousand dollars,
- Somerset, Five thousand five hundred dollars,
- Penobscot, Sixteen thousand seven hundred and twenty-five dollars,
- Waldo, Seven thousand five hundred dollars,
- Piscataquis, Thirty-three hundred and thirty-five dollars,
- Franklin, Three thousand one hundred and fifty dollars,
- Aroostook, Two thousand four hundred and twenty-five dollars.
