Chapter 153.

RESOLVE laying a tax on the several Counties in the State.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the several Counties contained in the following schedule be, and the same are hereby granted as a tax for each County respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debt and necessary expenses of the same and other purposes ordered by law.

- York, Five thousand five hundred dollars,
- Cumberland, Seventeen thousand dollars,
- Lincoln, Eight thousand dollars,
- Hancock, Five thousand five hundred dollars,
- Washington, Five thousand dollars,
- Kennebec, Twelve thousand six hundred and forty-two dollars,
- Oxford, Five thousand dollars,
- Somerset, Five thousand five hundred dollars,
- Penobscot, Sixteen thousand seven hundred and twenty-five dollars,
- Waldo, Seven thousand five hundred dollars,
- Piscataquis, Thirty-three hundred and thirty-five dollars,
- Franklin, Three thousand one hundred and fifty dollars,
- Aroostook, Two thousand four hundred and twenty-five dollars.

Chapter 154.

RESOLVE in favor of Dennis Fairbanks.

Resolved, That the Land Agent is hereby authorized to cancel and discharge the bond, given to the Land Agent to cancel bond of Sept. 6, 1839—

State by said Fairbanks on the sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, for the payment of the sum of one hundred and seventy-three dollars and two cents, also, one other bond given as aforesaid, on the fifteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty, for the payment of the sum of seventy-one dollars and one cent, one third part of the amount of each bond having been paid by said Fairbanks.

Chapter 155.

RESOLVE authorizing a temporary loan.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the State be, and he hereby is authorized to negotiate, on the faith and credit of the State, a temporary loan, not exceeding thirty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per cent., and for a term of time not exceeding six months; reimbursable out of the funds of the permanent loan authorized by a Resolve, passed March eleventh, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

Treasurer to negotiate temporary loan for \$30,000—

—not exceeding 6 per cent. interest—

—reimbursable from permanent loan within 6 months.

Chapter 156.

RESOLVE in favor of Nathaniel Bradstreet.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of the State, to Nathaniel Bradstreet, the sum of seven dollars and seventy-seven cents, for quarters furnished the soldiers in the Aroostook expedition.

N. Bradstreet, \$7 77, for quarters for soldiers in Aroostook expedition.
