Chapter 157.

RESOLVE in favor of Paul Hanson.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of the State, to Paul Hanson of Readfield, the sum of fifty-five dollars and four cents, in full for a bounty on nine hundred and four bushels of wheat, raised by Isaac Lewis of township number four, in eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, the claim for said bounty having been transferred from Lewis to Hanson, and presented by him to the treasurer of the nearest adjoining town according to law, but not received by said treasurer, nor presented to the Legislature for allowance, until after these accounts were passed upon in eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

Chapter 158.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Athens.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of this State, to the town of Athens, eleven dollars and twenty-five cents, in full for supplies and transportation of soldiers for the Aroostook expedition, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

Chapter 159.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Milo.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid, out of the treasury of the State, to the town of Milo, the sum of thirty-four dollars and twelve cents, in full for their expenses in furnishing the soldiers drafted in that town, for the Aroostook expedition in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.
