Chapter 160.

RESOLVE in favor of the Frontier Bank, Central Bank and the Bank of Westbrook.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of State be and he is hereby authorized, whenever he may be in funds not otherwise appropriated, to pay to the Frontier Bank the amount of a note now held by said Bank against the State, for the sum of ten thousand dollars and interest; also to pay to the Central Bank the amount of a note now held by said Bank against the State, for the sum of three thousand dollars and interest, and also to pay to the Bank of Westbrook the amount of a note now held by said Bank against the State, for the sum of one thousand dollars and interest; said loans authorized by a Resolve, passed February fifteenth, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, and payable at the pleasure of the State.

Chapter 161.

RESOLVE relative to the Commercial Bank of Bangor.

Resolved, That the Governor be directed to request the Bank Commissioners to examine into the doings and transactions of the Commercial Bank of Bangor, since the surrender of its charter.

Chapter 162.

RESOLVE in favor of the inhabitants of Chester.

Resolved, That all persons indebted to the State, for the purchase of land situated in the town of Chester, in the County of Penobscot, be allowed to pay one half of the sums so due on their notes, in labor to be expended in making a road through said town upon the Penobscot river. And the Land Agent is hereby

authorized so to receive and expend said sum, within two years from the passage of this Resolve. —under direction of the Land Agent, within two years.

Chapter 163.

RESOLVE providing for the repair of the Baring and Houlton road.

Resolved, That for the repairing of bridges and road through the Indian township, in the County of Washington, upon the Baring and Houlton road, there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of four hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council. And the Governor with advice of Council, is hereby authorized to appoint an Agent to superintend said work, at a compensation not exceeding two dollars per day. For repair of bridges and road, \$400.
Agent to expend, appointed by Gov. & Council.

Chapter 164.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Brighton.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of this State, to the town of Brighton, fifteen dollars, in full for supplies and transportation of soldiers for the Aroostook expedition, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. Brighton, \$15. for supplies for Aroostook expedition.

Chapter 165.

RESOLVE in favor of William Frost.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of the State, to William Frost, the sum of six dollars and fifty cents, it being for making out duplicates of division orders for a military draft, made in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine, in pursuance of a requisition of the Adjutant General. William Frost, \$6.50 for military services, 1839.
