Chapter 172.

RESOLVE making appropriations for military purposes.

Resolved, That there be allowed and granted, for the purposes hereinafter named, the following sums, to wit: for alteration and repair of artillery, three hundred dollars, for transportation and laboratory stores, two hundred dollars, for musical instruments and colors, two hundred dollars, for the erection of a gun-house in Gray, two hundred dollars, for completing the gun-house in Readfield, twenty-five dollars, for completing the gun-house in Monmouth, one hundred dollars, for completing the gun-house in Bangor, one hundred and sixty dollars, for labor taking care of military property in the arsenals, two hundred dollars, for the purchase of books of instruction for the general officers, one hundred dollars. The several sums aforesaid, to be paid whenever in the opinion of the Governor, with the advice of Council, the public service may require it; and for the faithful expenditure thereof, the acting quarter-master-general shall be accountable.

Chapter 173.

RESOLVE for the repairs of the Canada road.

Resolved, That for the purpose of repairing the Canada road in the County of Somerset, the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same hereby is appropriated; and the Governor and Council are hereby authorized to appoint an agent to superintend said work, the compensation of said agent not to exceed the sum of two dollars per day.

Chapter 174.

RESOLVE in favor of George Williston.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State, to George Williston of Brunswick, the sum
