**Chapter 179.**

AN ADDITIONAL RESOLVE in relation to the appointment of a Board of Commissioners to settle claims between certain individuals and the State.

*Resolved*, That the Resolves, approved March thirty-first, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, appointing the Justices of the District Courts, a Board of Commissioners to settle the claims between certain individuals and the State, shall become a law and take effect from and after the passage of this Resolve, that a majority of said Justices may constitute said Board, and be authorized and empowered to act in the premises, and that thirty days notice only, shall be given instead of the three months notice as required by said Resolves.

Resolves of Mar. 31, 1841, when to take effect.

Majority of Justices may act.

Thirty days notice to be given.

[Approved April 16, 1841.]

### Chapter 180.

RESOLVE establishing a Valuation for the State of Maine, April thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

*Resolved,* That the number of polls, and amount of estates, annexed to the several towns and plantations in the several Counties, and the aggregate of the several Counties in the foregoing schedule be, and the same are hereby established as the true number of polls, and valuation of estates of taxable polls, and estates of this State, until the further order of the Legislature.
