of Almond, in the County of Piscataquis, is the same town which is named in said resolves as the town of Milton; that the town of Usher, in the County of Oxford, is the same town which is named in said resolves as the town of Stoneham; that East Machias, in the County of Washington, is the same town which is named in said resolves as the town of Mechisses; and the said towns shall be classed respectively, as the towns named in said resolves; that that part of township numbered four in the third range of townships, in Bingham's Kennebec Purchase, which lies in the County of Somerset, be annexed to the Concord and Lexington representative district.

Chapter 189.

RESOLVE for paying of accounts against the State.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid, from the treasury of the State, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several cities, towns, plantations and persons, mentioned in the additional Roll of Accounts numbered twenty-two, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of nine thousand nine hundred fifty-one dollars and eighty-five cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands, to which they severally refer. \$9,951 85.
