Chapter 38.

AN ACT to fix the time of holding the court of county commissioners in the county of Aroostook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The court of county commissioners for the county of Aroostook, shall hereafter hold a session at Houlton, for said county on the first Tuesday of June in each year, in addition to the terms now required by law to be held in said county.

Commissioners of Aroostook co. authorized to hold a session in June, annually.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from its approval by the governor.

[Approved May 26, 1842.]

Chapter 39.

AN ACT to make valid the doings of towns in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. In all cases of town meetings heretofore held, in which the moderator of any such meeting has presided without having been previously sworn, the doings of such town shall not be deemed void or illegal in consequence thereof, *provided* that nothing in this act shall affect those towns which have held subsequent meetings in consequence of such omission.

Doings of town meetings in certain cases, legalized.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
