Chapter 5.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Townsend.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

- SECT. 1.** So much of the town of Boothbay in the county of Lincoln as is hereinafter described is hereby set off and incorporated into a new town by the name of Townsend, to have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of other towns in the state, viz: commencing at the mouth of Sheepscot river; thence north by the channel to the channel between Boston island and Spectacle island; thence easterly through Townsend gut, so called; thence through the channel between Mouse island and Oliver's point, and thence easterly round Squirrel island to the mouth of Sheepscot river, to the place begun at.
- SECT. 2.** That all taxes assessed by authority of the town of Boothbay which remain unpaid at the time of the passage of this act, shall be paid into the respective treasuries of said towns of Boothbay and Townsend, in the proportions in which said assessments were made upon the polls and estates, pertaining to said towns respectively; and all debts due from said town of Boothbay, shall be paid by said towns in said proportions; and all funds and debts and personal property belonging to said Boothbay, shall be divided in the same proportion; the same to be ascertained by the last valuation of the said town of Boothbay.
- SECT. 3.** All persons who are now, or hereafter may become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as belonging to that town on whose territory they may have gained their legal settlement, and shall be supported by the same; and said town of Townsend shall be holden to pay their proportion of the expenses, incurred for the support of paupers actually chargeable upon the town of Boothbay at the time of the passage of this act; said proportion to be ascertained by reference to the last valuation of the town of Boothbay.
- SECT. 4.** The several collectors of the town of Boothbay are hereby authorized to collect and pay all taxes, to them already committed, agreeably to their several warrants, any thing in this act to the contrary notwithstanding.
- SECT. 5.** The said town of Townsend shall pay their said proportion of all such state and county taxes, as are already, or may hereafter be assessed and apportioned on the inhabitants of the town of Boothbay, until the legislature shall lay a tax upon the town of Townsend.
- SECT. 6.** This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
