#### Chapter 16.

AN ACT to set off a part of Denmark, and annex the same to Bridgton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The following described tract of land is hereby set off from the Part of Denmark town of Denmark, in the county of Oxford and annexed to Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland, viz: beginning on the line Boundaries. between the counties of Oxford and Cumberland at the easterly corner of the lot lately owned by George Rounds and now occupied by Rebecca Rounds in said Denmark, and from thence south westerly on the south easterly line of the land of said Rounds to the waters of great Moose pond; thence northerly, on the easterly shore of said pond to the county line aforesaid, at the northerly corner of a gore of land now or recently owned by Barnabas Brackett; thence south easterly on said county and town line to the first bound.

### Chapter 17.

#### AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

In order to provide for the operation of certain acts and resolves Appropriation of of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treas- purposes. ury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the government, for the current year, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury; the same to be in lieu of all other existing appropriations whatever. the governor, with advice of the council is hereby authorized, at prior to Jan. 1, 1843. any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.
