CHAP. 20.

Chapter 20.

AN ACT to incorporate the Franklin Mechanics' Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Names of Corp-

SECT. 1. J. S. Swift, John F. Sprague, Lemuel Adams, Simon Pomeroy, Edward A. Noble, E. C. Marvel, John Kempton, Henry Stewart, Joshua Adams, Lorella Sweet, A. G. Wheeler, and Levi M. Williams, with their associates and successors are

hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Franklin

General powers.

Mechanic Association; and by that name may prosecute and defend suits at law, may have a common seal, may make by-laws for the government of said corporation, not repugnant to the laws of the State, may hold property to the value of one thousand dollars, and may have and exercise all the powers and privileges of similar corporations.

SECT. 2. J. S. Swift, John F. Sprague and Lemuel Adams, or any two of them, may call the first meeting of said corporation, by posting notices of the time and place of said meeting in two or more public places in the town of Farmington, seven days previous thereto.

Chapter 21.

AN ACT accepting the surrender of the charter of the St. Croix Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Surrender ac-
cepted.

SECT. 1. The surrender of the charter of the Saint Croix Bank is hereby accepted, and the same shall terminate when this act shall take effect.

To continue a
corporation three
years for certain
purposes.

SECT. 2. The said bank shall continue in its corporate capacity, for and during the term of three years from the time this act shall take effect, for the sole purpose of collecting the debts due the corporation, selling and conveying the property and estate thereof, and for choosing directors for the purposes aforesaid, and shall remain liable for the payment of all debts due from the same, and shall be capable of prosecuting and defending suits at law.

To publish no-
tice of surrender,
&c.

SECT. 3. The said bank shall publish for three months, weekly, in the state paper, and in one or more papers, if any there be, in the county in which said bank is located, that it has surrendered its charter, stating the time when the act accepting its surrender

took effect, and also the time when its liability to redeem its bills by law will expire. CHAP. 21.

SECT. 4. The said bank shall pay to the state treasurer a tax of one hundred and sixty six dollars and sixty seven cents, in addition to the amount due the state for taxes, which had accrued on or before the tenth day of October last. To pay to state treasurer an additional tax.

Chapter 22.

AN ACT to authorize the town of Addison to build a bridge across Pleasant river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of the town of Addison in the county of Washington, are hereby empowered to build and maintain a bridge across Pleasant river, in said town of Addison, at or within one hundred and fifty rods of Addison point (so called), *provided* said bridge shall be open at all times for the accommodation of travelers free of toll, and shall be built with a convenient draw or passage way at least thirty feet wide over the channel of said river, for the passing and repassing of vessels through said bridge, and said bridge shall be made of sufficient height for boats, rafts and gondolas to pass under the same, and said draw shall be lifted at all time for vessels to pass and repass without pay or toll. SECT. 2. An act entitled "an act to authorize William Nash of Addison and others to build a bridge across Pleasant river in the town of Addison," approved April sixteenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one, is hereby repealed. Act of April 16, 1841, repealed.
