Chapter 38.

AN ACT to incorporate the Waterville and Winslow Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Lucius Allen and Harrison A. Smith, their associates Names of corpoand successors be, and they are hereby incorporated and made a body politic by the name of the Waterville and Winslow Manufac. Corporate name. turing Company, with all the powers and privileges incident to sim- Powers, &c. ilar corporate bodies, and subject to all the duties and requirements of the acts of this state in relation to manufacturing companies and other corporations.

SECT. 2. The said company are hereby authorized, on their May build a dam. own land to build, rebuild and maintain a dam across the Kennebec Location, river from Waterville to Winslow, at the College Rips so called, for the purpose of manufacturing lumber and for any other purpose to which water power is usually applied.

SECT. 3. The said corporation shall at all times, maintain and keep in repair a keep in good repair over said dam a good, safe and convenient sluice way. sluice for running logs, boards, and other lumber down said river.

Chapter 39.

AN ACT to incorporate the Dresden-neck Bridge Company

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Henry Tallman, J. C. Tallman, David Clancy junior, Names of corporators. John Hathorn, John Webb, Charles C. Goodwin, William Carney, with their associates or assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Dresden-neck Bridge Company, with power by Corporate name. that name to sue and be sued, to have a common seal, to ordain, Powers, &c. establish and put in force any by-laws, for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to any laws of this state, and at any legal meeting, to choose the necessary officers for managing the business of said corporation, by a majority of the votes of proprietors present, allowing one vote to each share, provided, that no person shall be entitled to more than ten votes.

Said bridge shall be built across Eastern river, at a Location of place called Clancy's ferry, in the town of Dresden, to be built of suitable materials, not less than twenty feet wide, and all covered
