CHAP. 51.

Chapter 51.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled an "act authorizing the assessment of certain taxes upon the town of Old Town,"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Act of April 6,
1841, amended.

An act approved on the sixth day of April in the year eighteen hundred and forty one, entitled an act authorizing the assessment of certain taxes upon the town of Old Town, be so far amended as to authorize the treasurer of this State, and the county commissioners of the county of Penobscot, so far to alter the form of the warrants which they are respectively in said act authorized to issue, as to require the money to be collected from said town to be paid into their respective treasuries on or before the first day of September next.

Chapter 52.

AN ACT to incorporate the Prospect Mechanics' Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Names of corpo-
rators.

John Howe, junior, Henry D. Smith, Daniel Deshon, Loring B. Ridley, William P. Burrill, James Sinclair, George W. Mariner, William H. Towle, John Billings, James Curtis, and William Treat, with their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into

Corporate name.

a body politic by the name of the Prospect Mechanic Association, with power to use a common seal, sue and be sued, with all other powers usually granted to similar corporations, and with leave to hold real and personal property not exceeding five thousand dollars.

Chapter 53.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Expenditures of
government.

That in order to provide for the operation of certain acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of

the government, for the current year, the following sums be and the same are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury. And the governor, with the advice of council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrants on the treasurer of state for the same.
