Chapter 56.

AN ACT to repeal an act, entitled "an act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam Company," also "an act additional to an act, to incorporate the Kennebec Dam Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. An act entitled "an act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam Company," approved March seventh, eighteen hundred and thirty four, also an act entitled "an act additional to an act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam Company," approved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and thirty seven, be and the same are hereby repealed. And this act shall take effect from and after the first day of July next ; *provided however*, that if said company shall on or before the first day of August give to the governor and council such assurances as they may deem satisfactory, that the said company has cleared out the channel between the break-water and the shore below the lock on the east end of said dam so as to make the running of boats and rafts safe and convenient and put the said lock, and the piers above the lock, and the channel below, in good order for the safe and convenient running of rafts and boats through and by said dam, then this act shall not be in force, or take effect.

Act of March 7, 1834, repealed.

When to take effect. *Proviso.*
