Chapter 29.

Resolve in favor of Alexander G. Turner.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of state, out of any monies not otherwise appropriated, to Alexander G. Turner, of Hebron, the sum of ninety six dollars a year, for two years as a military pension, in consequence of a wound received while on military duty, on the twenty ninth day of September, 1841; commencing on the twenty ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty one, and payable quarterly in each year.

Chapter 30.

Resolve, making an appropriation for the repair of the "Houlton and Baring road."

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of two hundred dollars, for the repair of the "Houlton and Baring road," through the Indian township, in the county of Washington, to be expended under the direction of an agent, appointed by the governor and council, at a compensation, not to exceed one dollar and fifty cents per day.

Chapter 31.

Resolve in favor of Arthur L. Grant.

Resolved, That the treasurer be, and he hereby is, directed to pay out of the treasury, to Arthur L. Grant, eight dollars per month for one year, from the seventh day of September last, as a remuneration for injury received while doing military duty.
