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**RESOLVES**

PASSED BY THE

**LEGISLATURE OF MAINE,**

**1842.**

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*Resolved*, That such parts of the senatorial apportionment resolve of 1841 as are inconsistent with the provisions of the above amendatory resolve, be, and the same are hereby, rescinded.

CHAP. 49.

Resolves inconsistent, &c. repealed.

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### Chapter 50.

Resolve in favor of Abner B. Thompson, and others.

*Resolved*, That a further time of three years be allowed Abner B. Thompson, and the heirs, or assigns of Roscoe G. Greene, to complete a bond for the performance of settling duties, on certain lots of land in township number one Indian purchase: *provided* said Thompson, or the heirs or assigns of said Greene, shall on or before the first day of June next, pay to the state the balance due for said land.

A. B. Thompson et als. allowed 3 years to complete a bond.

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### Chapter 51.

Resolve in relation to the bequest of the late Bryce McLellan.

Whereas the late Bryce McLellan, by his last will and testament did bequeath to the institution of the insane hospital at Augusta, five hundred dollars; the interest or income of which sum was required to be applied annually to the benefit of said institution:

In relation to the bequest of the late Bryce McLellan.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized to demand and receive of Brooks Dascomb, executor of the last will and testament of Bryce McLellan late of Bloomfield, deceased, the bequest of five hundred dollars therein made to the institution of the insane hospital at Augusta; and that said sum be loaned permanently to the state, and the interest thereof applied annually to the institution, according to the provisions of the bequest in said will.

Treasurer authorized to receive the same.
