Chapter 52.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Brown.

Daniel Brown,
\$3 per month for
one year.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Daniel Brown, the sum of three dollars per month, for the term of one year, for an injury received while doing military duty.

Resolve authorizing the county commissioners of Aroostook county to hire money, for and on the faith of said county.

Co. Commission-
ers of Aroostook
authorized to
hire money.

Resolved, That the county commissioners of the county of Aroostook are hereby authorized to borrow on the faith and responsibility of said county, to meet the current expenses thereof, such sum or sums of money as they may deem necessary, not exceeding four thousand dollars, to be reimbursed within three years from the passage of this resolve.

Resolve, in aid of the deaf, dumb and blind.

Gov. and Council
authorized to
transfer certain
appropriations.

Resolved, That all, or any sums of money appropriated at the present or any subsequent session, for the relief of the indigent deaf and dumb or blind, may by the governor and council, be applied in such proportions, as they may think proper, to both or either of those objects, and expended in whole or in part for the instruction and education of such indigent persons, according to the necessities of the applicants, and also for paying any sums now due and unpaid, for either of the above purposes.

Resolve in favor of the inhabitants of township number two, first range, being the Waite township, in the county of Washington.

Resolved, That the amount that may be, hereafter, annually realized, for the period of three years, from the sale of hay cut on

the reserved lots in the Waite township, in the county of Washington, shall be appropriated for the support of a public school, in said township; and that the land agent be, and hereby is authorized, to pay over to the chairman of the superintending school committee, of the town of Topsfield, such amounts as may be realized from said sales, to be expended by him for the support of said school; and that the said chairman be also authorized to receive from Elijah D. Green, the amount due by said Green for hay already cut on said reserved lots, to be appropriated in the same manner.

Chapter 56.

Resolve in favor of Rufus McIntire.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, to Rufus McIntire, the sum of one thousand dollars in full for extraordinary services rendered by him to the state, as land agent, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty nine and eighteen hundred and forty, under the resolves passed by the legislature, and approved by the governor on the twenty fourth day of January, sixth and twentieth days of February, and the eighth, nineteenth and twenty third days of March, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty nine.

Resolve in favor of Otis Harwood.

Resolved, That upon the payment of one hundred dollars to the land agent, on or before the first day of December next, by Otis Harwood, the said agent be directed to confirm a certain deed of the state, given to Samuel H. Blake, dated the third day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty five.
