RESOLVES

PASSED BY THE

LEGISLATURE OF MAINE,

1842.

Chapter 64.

Resolve to reduce the valuation of township number one, second range, Bingham purchase, west of Kennebec river, and for abating the state and county tax on said township.

Resolved, That so much of a resolve, passed on the thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and forty one, as relates to the valuation of township number one, second range, Bingham's purchase, west of Kennebec river, in the county of Somerset, and to the aggregate valuation of said county be repealed, and that the valuation of said township be, one thousand dollars; and that the aggregate valuation of said county be, four millions, two hundred thirty five thousand, eight hundred and thirty two dollars; and that the treasurer of the state and the treasurer of the county of Somerset, be hereby directed to abate or refund, as the case may require, to the owners of said township, such portion of the state and county tax respectively, which may have been assessed, as the above correction in the valuation of said township may require.

Valuation of township No. 1, R. 2, B. pur. W. of K. river corrected.

Chapter 65.

Resolve equalizing the valuation of the towns of Parkman and Wellington.

Resolved, That the sum of four thousand, six hundred and ninety dollars and twenty two cents, be deducted from the valuation of the town of Parkman and that the same be added to the town of Wellington.

Valuation of Parkman and Wellington corrected.

Chapter 66.

Resolve, additional, for the payment of accounts against the state.

Additional Roll
of accounts, No.
23, \$7,790 69.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid, out of any money in the treasury of the state, not otherwise appropriated, to the several towns, plantations and persons, mentioned in the additional roll of accounts, number twenty three, the sums set against the names of such towns, plantations and persons respectively, amounting in the whole, to the sum of seven thousand, seven hundred and ninety dollars, and sixty nine cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands, to which they severally refer.

Chapter 67.

Resolve relating to a state burial ground, and the erection of certain monuments.

State burial
ground to be lo-
cated.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to select a portion of the public ground in front of the capitol for the interment of public officers dying at the seat of government, to define its limits in some suitable manner, and to ornament it with trees and in such other mode as they may deem expedient.

Monuments to be
erected.

Resolved, That the governor and council be further authorized to cause suitable and durable monuments to be erected over the graves of those persons who now are, or hereafter may be, interred upon the public grounds, with appropriate inscriptions.

Appropriation of
\$300 for the
same.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars be, and hereby is appropriated for the purposes mentioned in the foregoing resolves; and that the governor and council be requested to expend such further sums as may be placed in their hands for any of said purposes by private donations.
