and others on the northerly side of the public grounds and on that part of the line of fence belonging to the state to build. And that the governor with the advice of council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer, for the necessary expense thereof.

### Chapter 77.

Resolve in relation to the sale of township number three, in range thirteen.

*Resolved*, That Drummond Farnsworth and Atwood Levensaler be a committee to ascertain the present condition and value of township number three, in range thirteen, sold to William Emerson and others, in eighteen hundred and thirty five, with the quantity and value of the lumber taken therefrom since the sale in eighteen hundred and thirty five, and report the facts to the next legislature.

Committee to ascertain the value, &c. of township No. 3, R. 13.

*Resolved*, That said committee be authorized to investigate the terms and conditions of the sale of township number three, in range thirteen, to William Emerson and others, in eighteen hundred and thirty five, and report a statement of the money paid, and securities given for said township at the time of sale, giving the dates, names, amount and times of payment of the original notes. And further to ascertain and report the time, terms, conditions, and inducements of the change which was afterwards made in the securities for said township, stating what securities and names were surrendered, and what were taken in their place, with the dates, names, and times of payment, and by what authority, if any, exchange was made. And said committee are further authorized and directed, to ascertain and report the reasons and inducements which led the land agent to make the aforesaid exchange.

Authorized to investigate the terms of sale of said township, in 1835, &c.

And said committee are further authorized and directed, to ascertain whether a change or surrender of securities, has in any other case been made by any land agent of Maine, and report the reasons and inducements for such change or surrender; and said committee are further authorized and directed to ascertain and report if any allowances have been made to any individuals, in deviation from any contract made between said individuals and said land agent, and the reasons and inducements which led to such allowances.

To ascertain if land agent has surrendered securities, &c.

*Resolved*, That said committee are hereby vested with power to send for persons and papers, and to make such allowance to such persons, for time and travel, as shall be just and reasonable; and the land agent is hereby authorized to pay such allowance. And

said committee shall make a report of all their doings to the governor and council, and the governor and council shall take such measures in relation to the same as they may deem proper.

*Resolved*, That the governor with advice of council is hereby authorized to audit the accounts of said committee, and to allow them such compensation for their services as to them shall appear reasonable and proper; and the laud agent is hereby authorized to pay said committee the amount due them, allowed as aforesaid by the governor and council.

### Chapter 78.

Resolve to correct a clerical error in the valuation of the town of Mount Desert, and for correcting the state and county tax on said town.

*Resolved*, That so much of a resolve, passed on the thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty one, as relates to the valuation of the town of Mount Desert, in the county of Hancock, and so much of a resolve passed on the eleventh day of March, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty two, as relates to the aggregate valuation of said county, be repealed, and that the valuation of said town be one hundred ninety two thousand seven hundred and sixteen dollars, and that the aggregate valuation of said county be three million four hundred twenty eight thousand nine hundred and forty two dollars; and that the treasurer of state and the treasurer of the county of Hancock be hereby directed to abate or refund, as the case may require, to the said town of Mount Desert, such portion of the state and county tax respectively, which may have been assessed, as the above correction in the valuation of said town of Mount Desert may require.

### Chapter 79.

Resolve in favor of Spencer G. Bowes.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Spencer G. Bowes, four dollars per month for two years from the first day of January last, for an injury received while in the service of the state.
