CHAP. 86.**Chapter 86.**

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties in the state.

County tax.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the several counties, contained in the following schedule, be, and the same are hereby granted as a tax for each county respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debt and necessary expenses of the same and other purposes, ordered by law.

York, eight thousand dollars.

Cumberland, seventeen thousand dollars.

Lincoln, nine thousand dollars.

Hancock, seven thousand dollars.

Washington, five thousand, five hundred dollars.

Kennebec, fourteen thousand, two hundred and fifty five dollars.

Oxford, six thousand dollars.

Somerset, five thousand, five hundred dollars.

Penobscot, thirteen thousand, three hundred and thirty five dollars.

Waldo, eight thousand dollars.

Piscataquis, three thousand, six hundred and twenty dollars.

Franklin, three thousand, eight hundred dollars.

Aroostook, five thousand, five hundred and fifty dollars.

Chapter 87.

Resolve in favor of Hannah Simmons.

Hannah Simmons, §12.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury to Hannah Simmons of Hungry Island in the county of Lincoln, the sum of twelve dollars, it being the amount of surplus revenue, due to herself and her children.
