CHAP. 90.**Chapter 90.**

Resolve in relation to the Insane Hospital.

Committee to investigate affairs of the Insane Hospital.

Resolved, That Hon. Nathan Weston, Hon. Williams Emmons and Hon. Stephen C. Foster, be a committee to investigate the affairs and management of the Insane Hospital, and report their doings to the governor and council as soon as may be.

To report to governor and council, &c.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of said committee to inquire and report to the governor and council whether it is expedient to provide, by law, that all insane persons being citizens of this state, not adjudged by the superintendent of said hospital to be incurable, shall be supported in the hospital at the expense of the state; and also to inquire and report what further legislation, if any, is necessary to increase and extend the benefits of the hospital. And said committee shall each receive for his services, two dollars per day.

Compensation.

[*Approved March 18, 1842.*]**Chapter 91.**

Resolve providing for the repair of the "Mars-hill road."

Appropriation of \$1,500 for repair of Mars Hill road.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, for the repair of the Mars-hill road, to be applied between the south line of the east Indian township, and the town of Houlton, to be expended under the direction of an agent to be appointed by the governor and council, at a compensation not exceeding one dollar and fifty cents per day.

[*Approved March 18, 1842.*]**Chapter 92.**

Resolve in favor of William Hern.

Wm. Hern, §8.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to William Hern, the sum of eight dollars in full for his claim against the state as captain of the artillery company of Clinton.
