Chapter 93.

CHAP. 93.

Resolve in favor of the state prison.

Resolved, That the governor with advice of council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer, in favor of the warden of the state prison, for the sum of one thousand dollars, on account of purchases and disbursements for the use of the prison.

Chapter 94.

Resolve in favor of David Strout.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state to David Strout, four dollars per month for one year from the first day of January last, for an injury received while in the service of the state.

Chapter 95.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Brown and others.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to audit the accounts and pay over to Benjamin Brown and others, the amount which may be found due them for travel and attendance as witnesses, before a committee of the house of representatives the present session.

Chapter 96.

Resolve in favor of certain officers and soldiers of the revolutionary war.

Resolved, That the several resolves of the legislature in favor of certain officers and soldiers of the revolutionary war, and the widows of such officers and soldiers, approved on the seventeenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five, the eighth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, the twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty
