Chapter 23.**CHAP. 23.**

AN ACT to extend the powers of the constables of the town of Bristol in the county of Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The constables of the town of Bristol, in the county of Lincoln, shall have the same powers to serve and levy all writs, executions and other precepts to them directed, and issuing from competent authority, on the islands, called Muscongus and Harbor islands in said county of Lincoln, that they now have or may have, within the said town of Bristol, until said islands shall be legally entitled to elect their own constables.

Power of constables to serve writs in certain cases.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved March 22, 1843.]

Chapter 24.

AN ACT authorizing selectmen of towns and assessors of plantations to license auctioneers, not inhabitants of such towns and plantations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The selectmen of any town, and the assessors of any plantation, may license any suitable inhabitant of the county in which such town or plantation may be situated, by a writing under their hands, to be an auctioneer within their respective towns or plantations for one year.

Auctioneers to be licensed for towns and plantations where they are not residents.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

[Approved March 22, 1843.]

Chapter 25.

AN ACT for the preservation of salmon, shad, and alewives in Penobscot river and bay, and their tributary streams.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The governor with advice of council, shall appoint and commission three suitable persons, one of whom shall be a resident of each of the counties of Penobscot, Hancock and Waldo,

Appointment of county fish wardens.
