Chapter 60.

AN ACT to change the name of the town of Almond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That from and after the passing of this act, the town of Almond, Almond to be in the county of Piscataquis, shall be known and called by the name of Orneville.

[Approved January 24, 1843.]

Chapter 61.

AN ACT to set off a part of the town of Penobscot to the town of Surry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

All that part of the town of Penobscot, lying northerly and east-part of Penobscot erly of Toddy pond, so called, shall be, and the same is hereby, surry. annexed to the town of Surry.

[Approved January 31, 1843.]
