## PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

STATE OF MAINE,

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#### CHAP. 62.

#### Chapter 62.

AN ACT additional to an act to incorporate the trustees of Bethel academy. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Bethel academy to be called

The trustees of Bethel academy are hereby authorized Gould's academy to take, and shall be hereafter known by, the corporate name of the trustees of Gould's academy in Bethel, in substitution of the name and style by which they are now called and known.

Privileges and rights secured.

The said trustees shall be entitled to, and are hereby secured in, all the rights, privileges and immunities, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and duties, under the name and style of the trustees of Gould's academy in Bethel, as they have heretofore enjoyed and been subject to, by virtue of any and all the provisions of the act to which this act is in addition.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect from after its approval by the governor.

#### Chapter 63.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Mason.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Town of Mason How formed.

That Fryeburg academy plantation in the county of Oxford, bounded as follows, to wit: beginning on the west line of Bethel on the disputed line between Gilead and the said plantation, and thence running south seventy degrees west to the top of Cariboo mountain, thence on the ridge or crest of said mountain to the first division line in Bachelder's grant, as surveyed and marked by Jason Sherman, thence southerly on said first division line to the town of Usher, thence on said Usher to Albany, thence on said Albany to the south west corner of Bethel and thence on said Bethel to the place of beginning, with the inhabitants thereof, be, and the same are hereby, incorporated into a town by the name of Mason: and the inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, which the inhabitants of other towns within this State do or may by law enjoy.

Town meetinghow called.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within said county is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time

and place, as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns Chap. 64. are empowered to choose at their annual town meetings.

#### Chapter 64.

AN ACT authorising the assessment of a state tax on the town of Auburn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That the treasurer of state shall forthwith issue his warrant, State tax on directed to the assessors of the town of Auburn, requiring them to assess the sum of eight hundred and fifty one dollars and eighty eight cents upon the polls and estate of the inhabitants of that town, and upon the owners of real estate therein, according to the principles of the tax act, approved March eighteenth A. D. eighteen hundred and forty two, and requiring the money to be collected and paid unto the the treasurer of state, on or before the first day of September A. D. eighteen hundred and forty three. The said sum being the proportion which the said town of Aubnrn ought to have been assessed, in and by virtue said tax act.

#### Chapter 65.

AN ACT for the relief of the town of Minot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That the town of Minot, in the county of Cumberland, be ex- Town of Minot empted from the payment of eight hundred and fifty one dollars part of state tax. and eighty eight cents of the state tax, assessed on that town for the year eighteen hundred and forty two, that sum being so much above that town's proportion of said tax, and which sum should have been assessed on the town of Auburn.
