Chapter 67.

AN ACT to authorize the county commissioners for the counties of Cumberland and Lincoln, to lay out a road over the bridge erected on New Meadows river, at a place called Little Bull Rock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The county commissioners of the counties of Lincoln County commisand Cumberland, are hereby authorized, after petition and notice highway, and build a bridge as required by the twenty fifth chapter of the revised statutes, to after petition and notice. lay out a highway from High street in the town of Bath, county of Lincoln, over the bridge erected on New Meadows river, at a place called Little Bull Rock, to some point in the county of Cumberland.

SECT. 2. Nothing in this act shall be so construed, as to affect Powers and obli the powers and obligations imposed on the town of Bath by an act, not affected. passed March tenth, eighteen hundred and forty two, entitled "an act to authoize the town of Bath to erect a bridge over New Meadows river."

Chapter 68.

AN ACT to set off part of the town of Hope, in the county of Waldo, and annex the same to the town of Appleton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The following described portion of the town of Hope, Part of Hope anis hereby set off and annexed to the town of Appleton, to wit : ton. beginning on the northerly line of the town of Union, two miles and

CHAP. 69. one fourth of a mile from the southwesterly corner of the town of Hope, at a stake and stone, then by a straight line and such course as will strike the southerly line of the town of Searsmont, one mile and three fourths of a mile from the northwesterly corner of the town of Hope.

Liabilities of the inhabitants so set off.

Duty of selectmen.

To make return to secretary of state. SECT. 2. The inhabitants on the territory aforesaid, shall pay to the inhabitants of the town of Hope, all moneys now legally assessed on their polls and estates and remaining unpaid, and also their just proportion of all debts now due from the said town of Hope; and if there should be any such debts due, the assessors of the said town of Appleton, shall assess and levy a sufficient tax upon the inhabitants of that part of Hope set off to Appleton, as shall be sufficient to pay their just proportion of the debts aforesaid.

SECT. 3. It shall be the duty of the selectmen of the town of Appleton to notify the selectmen of the town of Hope, within fifteen days after the passage of this bill, to meet for the purpose of ascertaining the line between the two towns by survey according to the provisions of this act. It shall also be the duty of the selectmen of Hope to make returns to the secretary of state, by the first day of March next, of the proportion of the state valuation of so much of said town of Hope, as is set off by this act to the town of Appleton.

Chapter 69.

AN ACT to repeal an act, entitled "an act to repeal an act, entitled, 'an act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam company,'" also "an act additional to an act, to incorporate the Kennebec Dam company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

To repeal an act passed May 27, 1842. An act entitled "an act to repeal an act, entitled, 'an act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam company,'" also "an act additional to an act, to incorporate the Kennebec Dam company," approved May twenty seventh in the year eighteen hundred and forty two, be and the same is hereby repealed.
