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## Chapter 70.

## CHAP. 70.

AN ACT in relation to the tax assessed on the members of the Brunswick village corporation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The treasurer of the town of Brunswick, is hereby authorized to sue for and collect, all or any moneys in the hands of Richard Holland or his bondsmen, or in the hands of any other person or persons, whomsoever, which was raised by a tax assessed on the members of the Brunswick village corporation.

Treasurer of Brunswick, to collect moneys due the village corporation.

SECT. 2. All moneys received or collected by virtue of this act, shall be applied to the use and purposes for which it was originally assessed and collected ; and the selectmen of Brunswick are hereby authorized to appropriate the same.

To what purposes to be applied.

## Chapter 71.

AN ACT to authorize the town of Milford to build a part of a certain road in the town of Greenbush and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. That the inhabitants of the town of Milford be authorized, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to build such part of the county road, heretofore laid out, running east from Penobscot river through the said town of Milford, and through the south part of the town of Greenbush, into and through the town of Greenfield in this state, lying within said town of Greenbush, as two thirds of the legal voters of said town of Milford, shall in a legal town meeting, held for the purpose, vote to build.

Town of Milford authorized to build a part of county road, if voted so to do in town meeting.

SECT. 2. The said inhabitants shall, after having voted as aforesaid to build any part or all of said road, lying within said town of Greenbush, be authorized and empowered by major vote, to raise such sum or sums of money, as may be necessary to build and make the road aforesaid, to be expended in labor or money on said road, as the said inhabitants shall determine ; with power to choose such agent or agents, or other officers, as said town of Milford may deem necessary and proper, to superintend the laying out of said money within said town of Greenbush, and such person or persons so chosen to superintend the laying out said money, shall possess and exercise all the powers, rights and privileges, which

### Chapter 72.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Hanover.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Boundaries.

SECT. 1. That all that part of the town of Bethel which is bounded on the north by Howard's gore, commencing at the most westerly corner of said gore, thence south to the channel of the Androscoggin river—thence on the south channel of said river, until it strikes the line of Rumford; thence to the south east corner of said gore, and the inhabitants thereof—together with Howard's gore and the inhabitants thereof, are hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Hanover, vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties of other incorporated towns in this state.

Liabilities of inhabitants set off from Bethel.

SECT. 2. The inhabitants of said town of Hanover, which are set off from the town of Bethel by this act, shall be holden to pay the arrears of all taxes which have been legally assessed on them, and of assessments which may have been voted by said town of Bethel at the time this act shall take effect; and the said town of Hanover shall be entitled to receive and hold their proportion of the taxes due to said town of Bethel; said proportion to be ascertained by the last valuation of their respective towns, and also their proportion of the ministerial and school fund, belonging to said town of Bethel, said proportion to be ascertained by their relative proportion of population, according to the census taken in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty.

Paupers in the town of Bethel, how supported.

SECT. 3. All persons now chargeable as paupers to said town of Bethel, shall be supported by the town of Bethel and that portion of said town of Bethel, which by this act is incorporated into the town of Hanover; and the said town of Hanover shall be liable and holden to pay its due proportion of all debts, now due and owing from, and all liabilities now existing against said town of Bethel, in proportion to their valuation for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty. And all persons who may hereafter become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as belonging to that town on whose territory they may have gained a legal settlement, and shall be supported by the same.
