## PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

#### Chapter 72.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Hanover.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Boundaries.

Sect. 1. That all that part of the town of Bethel which is bounded on the north by Howard's gore, commencing at the most westerly corner of said gore, thence south to the channel of the Androscoggin river—thence on the south channel of said river, until it strikes the line of Rumford; thence to the south east corner of said gore, and the inhabitants thereof—together with Howard's gore and the inhabitants thereof, are hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Hanover, vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties of other incorporated towns in this state.

Liabilities of inhabitants set off from Bethel.

SECT. 2. The inhabitants of said town of Hanover, which are set off from the town of Bethel by this act, shall be holden to pay the arrears of all taxes which have been legally assessed on them. and of assessments which may have been voted by said town of Bethel at the time this act shall take effect; and the said town of Hanover shall be entitled to receive and hold their proportion of the taxes due to said town of Bethel; said proportion to be ascertained by the last valuation of their respective towns, and also their proportion of the ministerial and school fund, belonging to said town of Bethel, said proportion to be ascertained by their relative proportion of population, according to the census taken in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty.

Liabilities of town of Hanover to Bethel.

of Bethel, shall be supported by the town of Bethel and that portion of said town of Bethel, which by this act is incorporated into the town of Hanover; and the said town of Hanover shall be liable and holden to pay its due proportion of all debts, now due and owing from, and all liabilities now existing against said town of Bethel, in proportion to their valuation for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty. And all persons who may hereafter become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as belonging to that town on whose territory they may have gained a legal settlement,

and shall be supported by the same.

Sect. 3. All persons now chargeable as paupers to said town

Persons hereafter becoming pau-pers, how supportéd.

Sect. 4. The several collectors of taxes for the town of Bethel  $\frac{C_{\text{HAP}}}{73}$ . are hereby authorized and empowered to collect and pay all taxes Duties of the collectors of Bethel. to them already committed agreeably to their several warrants, and all taxes which may have been legally assessed, and which may be hereafter committed to said collectors.

The said town of Bethel shall retain the entire property and interest in any and all public buildings now owned by Bethel to retain its property. said town.

Sect. 6. Until another state valuation shall be taken all state and county taxes shall be assessed upon said towns in proportion Assessment of to the valuation for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

#### Chapter 73.

AN ACT to repeal an act entitled "an act authorizing the erection of a bridge over New Meadows river."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

### Chapter 74.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In order to provide for the operation of certain acts and resolves Appropriations of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the government, for the current year, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury; the same to be in lieu of all other existing appropriations whatever. the governor, with advice of the council, is hereby authorized at his warrants pri-
