Chapter 75.

AN ACT to incorporate the Orono Mechanics' Association. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Samuel Buffum, Levi Dennet, William Durgin, Eliph- Corporators. alet Perkins, junior, Obadiah Holt, Israel Brown, Benjamin Frost, Seth F. Cook, Samuel S. Dakin, Myrick Emerson, Hugh Read, Abner Starrett, A. W. Weymouth and William G. Bent, with their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into a body politic by the name of the Orono Mechanics' Association, with power Name. to sue and be sued; to have a common seal and change the same; Powers, to make any by laws for the government of said corporation not repugnant to the laws of the State, and to take and hold real estate to the value of five thousand dollars.

William G. Bent is hereby authorized to call the first First meeting, meeting of said association, by posting up notices of the same in two public places in the town of Orono, at least seven days previous thereto.
