### Chapter 128.

AN ACT to incorporate the Swanville Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Joseph Smart, Simeon H. Nickerson, Josiah Staples, Tully R. Nickerson, Solomon Cunningham, Nathaniel Haynes, Emery Nickerson, Reuben S. Smart, John Stephens, Miles Staples and Henry W. Cunningham, with their associates and successors, hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Swanville Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing wool, cotton, iron, steel and wood, in the town of Swanville, and the said corporation may erect such mills, dams, works, machines and buildings, and dig such canals on their own lands, as may be necessary to carry on such manufactures; and to have and to hold real and personal estate to an amount, not to exceed, at any one time, seventy five thousand dollars in value, and to have power to give, grant, sell and dispose of the same: and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements of the several acts of this state, defining the general powers and duties incident to manufacturing companies.
